

## A Resolution Ending the Bush Tax Cuts

1. Whereas the United States is facing mounting debts and

3. grown in the past 10 years and

6. Therefore be it resolved that
7. The bill calling for an extension of the Bush Tax Cuts should be tabled.

## A Resolution Regarding the European Union

3. reform seriously and
4. Whereas the European Union has not demanded enough reform from the countries
5. in crisis.

7. The United States will not offer any money to the International Monetary fund to aid
8. the European Union in any bailouts.

## A Bill Regarding Capital Punishment

1. Section 1: The use of capital punishment is abolished in the federal level and
2. on the state level.
3. Section 2: All prisoners currently sentenced to the death penalty will have their
4. sentences commuted to life imprisonment.
5. Section 3: This law will take effect immediately.
6. Section 4: All laws on the federal and state level contradicting this law will be void.

## A Resolution to Increase Financial Regulation

1. Whereas, financial deregulation contributed greatly to the current and recent financial crisis, and
2. Whereas, the current system encourages moral hazard on the part of the financial industry, and
3. Whereas returning to a system based on the world of Glass-Steagall would return the United
4. States to sound financial footing
5. Be it Resolved by this student congress assembled that a regulatory system based on Glass-
6. Steagall be implemented.

## A Bill to Regulate Tuition Raises

1. Section One: The rate of tuition increase at all educational institutions that receive federal
2. funds in any form shall be capped at the rate of inflation for the previous year.
3. Section 2: All student fees, room and board costs, and other fees shall be considered to be
4. tuition for the purposes of this legislation
5. This legislation shall take effect on June 30, 2013.

## A Bill to Restore Sanity to the Tax Code

1. Section 1 The federal excise tax for manufacturing fishing tackle boxes shall be set at
2. ten percent for the 2013 fiscal year.
3. Section 2- This legislation shall be enforced by the appropriate regulatory and taxation
4. bodies.
